

Dear Colleague,

The 10-year anniversary of the International Pulmonary Hypertension (PH) Forum provides an excellent opportunity to reflect on progress in the field of PH, a group of clinical conditions characterised by increased pressure in the pulmonary circulation. The way we define and classify these conditions has been refined over recent years, and along with better disease awareness and diagnostic techniques, this has led to improvements in PH diagnosis. The recently updated ESC/ERS Guidelines provide robust guidance on treating PH, and the number of pharmacological therapies available has increased dramatically. In particular, substantial progress has been made for pulmonary arterial hypertension (PAH), resulting in the availability of drugs that target three distinct pathogenic pathways. Importantly, these advances have translated into improved quality of life and prognosis for PH patients.

Although progress has moved at an unprecedented pace, there is no room for complacency. Better patient outcomes are being sought by employing optimal management strategies such as a treat to target approach. Setting treatment goals for the patient is central to this approach, and ambitious targets such as achieving and maintaining functional class II are being included to drive improved patient outcomes. Other strategies that aim to benefit PAH patients focus on the importance of early disease identification. Guidelines recommend initiating therapy even in patients with early disease, as evidence suggests that early treatment is a critical component of optimal disease management. An equally important element of a treat to target approach is the use of combination therapy, as recommended in the ESC/ERS Guidelines, to target different pathogenic pathways in patients who do not respond adequately to monotherapy.

At the much anticipated annual PH Forum, renowned experts will provide informative and educational updates on new developments in the field of PH. There will be a strong practical focus to the meeting with an emphasis on transferring evidence-based guidelines to clinical practice. The echocardiography workshop and breakout sessions will allow participants to focus in detail on areas that are relevant to their clinical practice, and patient case presentations will be used to highlight key facets of managing PH. We encourage you to get involved in all aspects of the meeting, which will provide an excellent opportunity to share knowledge and ideas with other clinicians and researchers.

We are delighted to invite you to the 10th International PH Forum where we will celebrate a decade of progress in PH and focus on improving the outlook for our patients.
