#### **DEAR COLLEAGUE,**

Years of dedication and collaboration within the pulmonary hypertension (PH) community have vastly increased our knowledge of this progressive disease. This has led to the increasingly intelligent use of targeted therapies and evidence-based management strategies, resulting in improvements in long-term patient outcomes.

Recently there has been a strong focus on further improving outcomes for pulmonary arterial hypertension (PAH) patients by using multi-parameter risk assessment and by making timely use of all the therapeutic options that are available. Several studies have highlighted the importance of attaining a low-risk profile, and the importance of risk assessment in guiding treatment strategies. Nevertheless, all too many patients do not attain a low-risk profile and despite the mounting evidence to support combination therapy, it is underutilized in clinical practice. These challenges will be a focus for discussion during the Forum alongside practical considerations of what constitutes optimal therapy for patients at different stages of disease.

The 18th International PH Forum will provide an opportunity to discuss these key themes, as well as exploring PAH populations of special interest, such as portopulmonary hypertension, and other forms of PH beyond group 1 that represent a substantial burden for society due to the significant numbers of patients affected. The burden that PH has on the everyday lives of patients will also be examined as part of a multidisciplinary patient-centred discussion. Targeted breakout sessions will encourage discussion of multiple topics of interest and will provide insight into PH subtypes and challenging aspects of PH management using patient cases as illustrative examples. Additionally, interactive workshops will provide practical guidance on cardiopulmonary rehabilitation and the art of imaging in PH. The main program will once again be accompanied by a dedicated nurse program to underline the crucial role that nurses play in the management of all patients with PH.

We are delighted to invite you to this year's PH Forum. We hope this opportunity to share knowledge and exchange experiences can be utilized to broaden our understanding and further benefit our PAH patients.
