Appendix I – Micro teaching session (Live Demo)

Each participant will give a 10-minute live demo on practical teaching of US assessment of an anatomic area (i.e. shoulder, elbow, wrist/hand, hip, knee, ankle/foot) and a 10- minute lecture among the below listed.

The live demo will be randomly chosen onsite (appendix I). The teachers will provide feedback and assessment on each live demo onsite.

Appendix I. Topics of live demos

1. Ultrasound scanning of the shoulder
2. Ultrasound scanning of the elbow
3. Ultrasound scanning of the wrist and hand
4. Ultrasound scanning of the hip
5. Ultrasound scanning of the knee
6. Ultrasound scanning of the ankle and foot

Appendix II – Micro teaching session (Lecture)

The participants should prepare a 20-minute lecture (power point presentation) on the assigned topic which should be sent to the Faculty before the course. A lecture from appendix II will be randomly assigned to each participant before the course by the organisers.

The participants will receive feedback from the teachers before the course. The participants should deliver a part (10 minutes) of the pre-prepared lecture at the course. The teachers will also provide feed-back and assessment on each lecture on-site.

6. Sonoanatomy, scanning technique and basic pathology of the wrist and hand
7. Sonoanatomy, scanning technique and basic pathology of the hip
8. Sonoanatomy, scanning technique and basic pathology of the knee
9. Sonoanatomy, scanning technique and basic pathology of the ankle and foot
10. Doppler US applications and limitations in rheumatology
