

## Radboud Grand Rounds

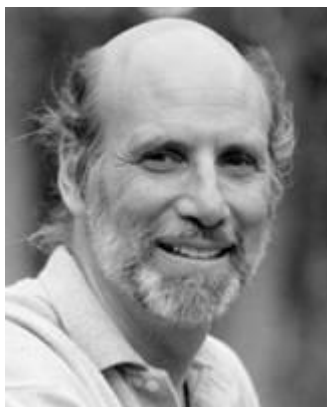


Dear colleague,

### **Staying Human in Medicine: from THE HOUSE OF GOD to MAN'S 4TH BEST HOSPITAL**

Forty years ago, **THE HOUSE OF GOD** described a brutal passage through medical training. Shem will describe the reasons for that inhumanity, and how to stay human. The essence is the danger of isolation, and the healing power of good connection. What is good connection? Mutual connection. Shem will also read from the sequel to **THE HOUSE OF GOD**, his new novel **MAN'S 4TH BEST HOSPITAL**, about the inhumanities of medicine *now*--money and screens (EMRs)--which in the USA means "money and money." To be published in November 2019.



**Samuel Shem**, pen name of Stephen Bergman is a novelist, playwright, essayist and activist. A graduate of Harvard College and Medical School, and Oxford as a Rhodes Scholar, he was on the faculty for 35 years.

His novel, *The House of God* (1978), was named by the British medical journal *The Lancet* as one of the most two important American medical novels of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

Samuel Shem gives a key note during the 6<sup>th</sup> international meeting of the World Society of Emergency Surgery, that takes place in the Radboud university medical center from June 25 until June 28.
