Speakers and Chairmen

Guido Tytgat was the head of Gastroenterology in the AMC; he is an internationally renowned gastroenterologist and is considered the godfather of Dutch Gastroenterology.

Inge Baas is oncologist at the UMC Utrecht and one of Johan's first PhD graduates.

Paul van Diest is the Head of the Department of Pathology at the UMC Utrecht.

Miangela Laclé is gastrointestinal pathologist at the UMC Utrecht; she is the PI of the pathology branch of the Dutch T1CRC Working Group.

Hans Clevers is group leader at the Hubrecht Institute, professor of Molecular Genetics at the UMC Utrecht and Onco Investigator. He is the architect of organoid technology.

Joel Greenson is gastrointestinal pathologist at Michigan Medicine, University of Michigan. He is the president of the United States and Canadian Association of Pathology (USCAP). He was clinical GI-path fellow at Johns Hopkins together with Johan.

Josbert Keller is gastroenterologist at HaaglandenMC and Director of the National Faeces Biobank in Leiden.

Laura Wood is gastrointestinal pathologist at The Johns Hopkins Medical Institutions and internationally renowned researcher of the genetics of pancreatic and colorectal cancer.

Fiebo ten Kate is professor emeritus and one of Johan's closest colleagues in GI pathology in The Netherlands.

Roeland de Wilde is fellow in hepatopancreaticobiliary (HPB) surgery at ErasmusMC and PhD graduate of Johan; he is also Johan's neighbor.

Ralph Hruban is Director of the Department of Pathology of The Johns Hopkins Medical Institutions and the Sol Goldman Pancreatic Cancer Research Center at Hopkins, the most renowned multidisciplinary research group on pancreatic cancer.

Lodewijk Brosens is molecular biologist and gastrointestinal pathologist at the UMC Utrecht and RadboudUMC. His expertise is in pancreatic pathology.

Marnix Jansen is molecular biologist and gastrointestinal pathologist at the University College London and Barts Cancer Institute. His research interest is in the evolution of Barrett esophagus and gastric cancer precursor lesions.

Chris Wolfgang is Chief, Division of Surgical Oncology and John L. Cameron Professor of Surgery at the Johns Hopkins Hospital. He has a PhD in biochemistry and is an eminent researcher as well.

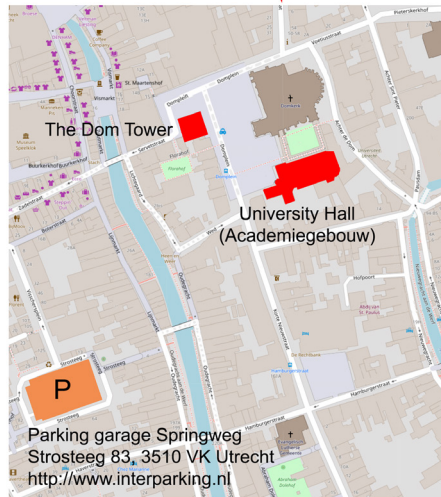
