Practica

- 1. Four personal sessions with a Fellow or an Advanced Trainee who has given at least 35 Bonny Method of GIM sessions, has received at least five supervisions, and is recommended by the Primary Trainer.
- 2. Ten single Bonny Method of GIM guiding sessions conducted under the responsibility of the Level II Primary Trainer. It is recommended that each be with a different traveler and follow the Level II training seminar (a). These sessions may not be with members of psychiatric populations with psychotic symptoms. The sessions may include one-hour Bonny Method sessions using Bonny Method music programs that have been shortened, they can also be Music and Imagery or group music and imagery.
- 3. Music Analysis: Analysis of a GIM music program following Bruscia ("Note 19 AN APPROACH TO ANALYZING MUSIC PROGRAMS" Excerpt From: Kenneth E. Bruscia. "Notes on the Practice of Guided Imagery and Music.") This analysis van be made with a fellow student.
