19.05 CET, 18.05 BST - Aesthetics and accessibility: Keys for optimal superstructure design

General dentists must provide the highest quality of care to their patients. To ensure that patients are comfortable and satisfied, dentists need to consider aesthetic and functional requirements when they design and place implants. This session will focus on the aesthetic and functional requirements of dental implants, and how to design the superstructure and how to prevent corner effects in order to provide the patient with good oral health.

There is growing evidence that the association between DM and P is a greater risk for the development of infections from patients without diabetes. In particular, periodontitis in diabetic patients is associated with more severe periodontitis and a higher risk for systemic complications.
